Call for Papers

The 40th Annual Conference of the Eighteenth-Century Ireland Society/An Cumann Éire san Ochtú Céad Déag is scheduled to take place in the Long Room Hub at Trinity College Dublin on **5-6 June 2025**.

Proposals are hereby invited for twenty-minute papers (in English or Irish) on any aspect of eighteenth-century Ireland, including its history, literature, language, and culture. The Eighteenth-Century Ireland Society is a multidisciplinary organisation and we welcome papers from all relevant disciplines (English, History, Art History, Irish, Music, and European Languages), including interdisciplinary and comparative research studies.

In the year the society celebrates its fortieth anniversary we are especially keen to welcome contributions that reflect the broad interdiscipilinary nature of the Eighteenth-Century Ireland Society. As we approach the 300th anniversary of the publication of *Gulliver's Travels* and the 250th anniversary of the outbreak of the American War of Independence in 2026 we encourage papers that reflect on these events and their Irish contexts. Papers that reflect on teaching or other methodological approaches to eighteenth-century Irish studies are also very welcome. We are happy to accept both proposals for individual papers and for three-paper panels.

The conference, which is hosted in association with the Trinity Long Room Hub, will feature keynote addresses from Professor Mark Caball (UCD), Professor James Kelly (Dublin City University), and Professor Christina Morin (University of Limerick).

Proposals should include: the speaker's name, institutional affiliation, title of paper, and a 250-word abstract. A decision in relation to the proposal will be communicated to prospective speakers by mid-March. Successful applicants should hold valid ECIS membership at the time of the conference.
